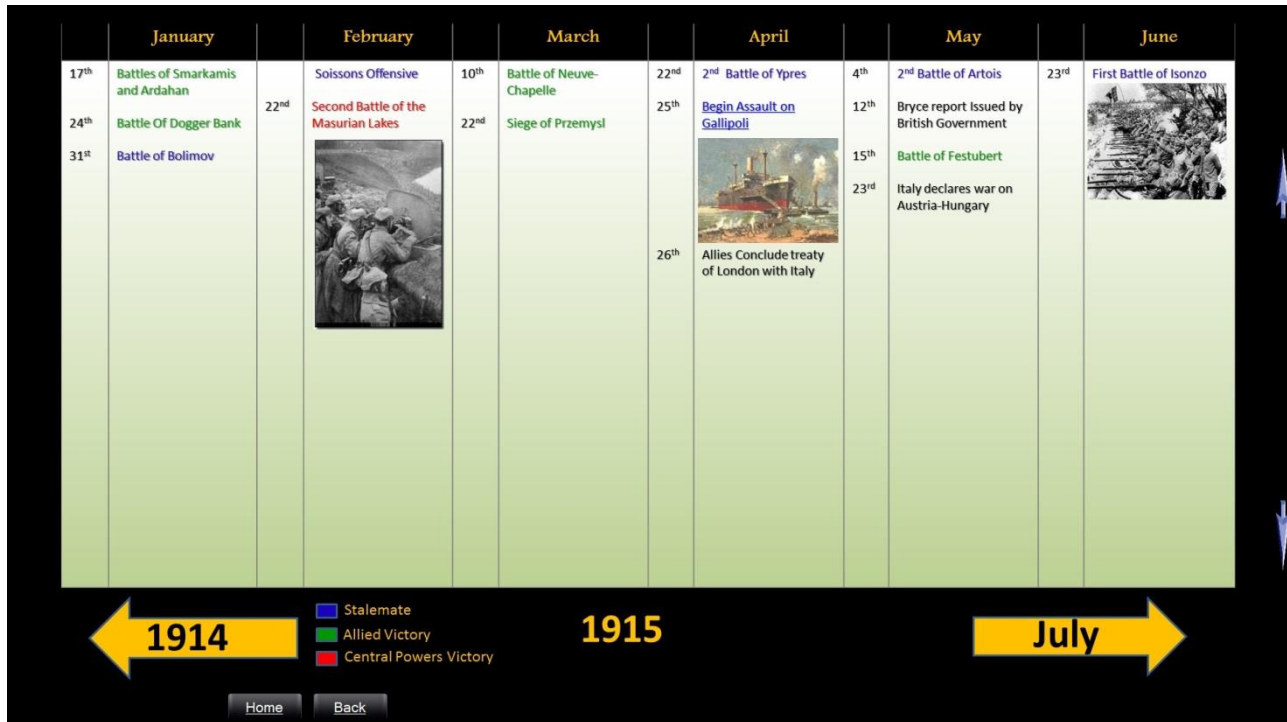

What's in the Package?

A foundation that any museum can build upon to create their own customised timeline.

The basic timeline is supplied populated with the major battles that occurred between 1914 and 1918. It begins with the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand, and the declarations of war that subsequently followed, and ends with the Treaty of Versailles. The timeline is designed to provide a basis for any museum to build its own timeline upon. It can easily be customized to include other events, as well as hyperlinks to more detailed information.

Make it Your Own

The timeline is already populated with the major battles and some events. However, because it is created as a PowerPoint presentation, it can easily be customized to include other pictures and events, as well as hyperlinks to more information.

Simple to Use

Users can roll the timeline backwards and forwards by touching the arrows. With minor modifications flick-based navigation can be used with multi-touch hardware.

Hyperlinks can take the user to additional information; either added as pages within the timeline presentation or to external presentations, documents or web pages.

Easy to Change

If you, as an InfoAktiv system's owner, want to change the layout or structure it is as easy as rearranging folders and files with Windows Explorer. The timeline itself is modified by using Microsoft PowerPoint.

Graphics, text and categories can be customized and expanded to add your own information or branding. Anybody with basic PC skills can do this.
